

Learn what you can do with a *my* Social Security account



Securing today
and tomorrow

If you do not receive benefits, you can:

- Request a replacement Social Security card (if you meet certain requirements);
- Check the status of your application or appeal;
- Get your *Social Security Statement*, to review:
 - Estimates of your future retirement, disability, and survivors benefits;
 - Your earnings once a year to verify the amounts that we posted are correct; and
 - The estimated Social Security and Medicare taxes that you have paid.
- Get a Benefit Verification Letter stating that:
 - You never received Social Security benefits, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), or Medicare;
 - You received benefits in the past, but do not currently receive them. The letter will include the date your benefits stopped and how much you received that year; or
 - You applied for benefits, but have not received an answer yet.

If you receive benefits or have Medicare, you can:

- Request a replacement Social Security card (if you meet certain requirements);
- Report your wages if you work and receive Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments;
- Get your Benefit Verification Letter;
- Check your benefit and payment information and your earnings record;
- Change your address and phone number;
- Start or change direct deposit of your benefit payment;
- Request a replacement Medicare card; and
- Get a replacement SSA-1099 or SSA-1042S for tax season.

A *my* Social Security

account is where you go to check your Social Security information and conduct business with us.

To establish an account, you must:

- Have a valid email address;
- Be at least 18 years of age;
- Have an SSN; and
- Have a U.S. mailing address
